# Summary Information

### 2.1 Drug Programs

#### 2.1.1 Effectiveness Of Programs

The following school drug and alcohol programs are listed in order from most effective to least effective as determined by your personnel who expressed an opinion (percentage is based on those who **Agree** or **Strongly Agree** of those who agree or disagree):

- Parent, Teacher, Student Association (71.3% deemed effective)
- Policy For Dealing With Violence (60.6% deemed effective)
- Crisis Intervention Team (48.9% deemed effective)
- Student Assistance Program (47.2% deemed effective)
- Employee Assistance Program (42.7% deemed effective)
- Alcohol And Drug Curriculum For All Grades (42.1% deemed effective)
- Student Anti-Drug Organization or Program (41.4% deemed effective)
- Violence Prevention Program (36.0% deemed effective)
- Teacher Training Programs For Drug Prevention Ed. (26.3% deemed effective)
- Programs For Students With An Alcohol and Drug Problem (24.7% deemed effective)
- Drug Awareness/Ed. Program For Parents (24.4% deemed effective)
- Support Groups For Alcohol and Drug Recovering Students (19.8% deemed effective)

## 2.2 Safety In The Workplace

57.3% of the faculty and staff said their workplace is safe, while 42.7% said their workplace is **not safe**. Personnel in the latter groups said they **Agree** or **Strongly Agree** with the following reasons as to why they consider their workplace unsafe:

- Poor parental support for school policies (61.5%)
- Influence Of Violence In Movies And Music (54.0%)
- Students Being More Violent Than In The Past (51.4%)
- Rules Being Unclear Or Not Enforced (40.0%)
- Outsiders Coming Into The School (32.0%)
- Lack of security officer (police) at my school (26.0%)
- Alcohol And/Or Drug Use By Students (20.4%)

- Drug Dealing By Students (18.3%)
- Students Who Carry Weapons (14.0%)
- Lack Of Cooperation When Police Are Called (7.5%)

## 2.3 Drug Policy

### 2.3.1 Knowledge of School Drug Policy

The following list shows the percentage of faculty and staff who agreed (i.e. responded **Agree** or **Strongly Agree**) with the following statements:

- School personnel know that information which is life threatening must be disclosed (79.9%)
- School personnel understand the school drug policy (69.1%)
- School personnel know the consequences of student drug use (64.0%)
- School personnel know how to get help from outside the school for students who use alcohol and drugs (63.1%)

### 2.3.2 Compliance With School Drug Policy

The following list shows the percentage of faculty and staff who agreed (i.e. responded **Agree** or **Strongly Agree**) with the following statements:

- School personnel always report students whom they suspect of using or dealing drugs (60.9%)
- The school policy on drugs is applied fairly (58.4%)
- The school policy on drugs is applied consistently (55.0%)
- Strict enforcement of drug policy has minimized our problems (42.2%)

## 2.4 Drug Use

81.8% of the faculty and staff believe that students used marijuana within the past year. In order to estimate the percentage of the student population the faculty and staff believe are using marijuana, a mean category score is calculated. The mean category score is 3.108 which best corresponds to the category of 5-15%. This means that, on average, the faculty and staff believe that 5-15% of the students used marijuana in the past year.

According to last years PRIDE National Summary, 1.1% of 4th-5th grade students used marijuana at least once a year, 9.3% of 6th-8th grade students used marijuana at least once a year, and 28.8% of 9th-12th grade students used marijuana at least once a year.

## 2.5 Drug Information Quiz

The average score on the drug information quiz was 68.5%. This fell below the suggested average score of 77.8%.

In looking at the results of the drug knowledge quiz slight differences in the percentage figures may be found between the quiz results section and the percentage figures found in the tables chapter for these questions. In the case of the tables chapter all tables have a *N of Valid* and a *N of Missing* column which represents the number of respondents who actually marked a response to the question and the number of respondents who left the question blank, respectively. All tables in the tables chapter calculate percentage figures based on valid responses only (i.e. blank responses are ignored). However, when scoring the quiz a blank response is counted as an incorrect response (i.e. blank responses are NOT ignored). The figures in the **Drug Information Quiz** section more accurately reflect how well all participants performed on the quiz.

### 2.5.1 Alcohol Quiz Results

The following list ranks from highest to lowest how well participants answered the quiz for this drug category.

- May cause liver damage (correct response is YES) (94.7% answered correctly)
- Will decrease reaction time (correct response is YES) (90.8% answered correctly)
- 10% of Alcohol users become addicted (correct response is YES) (76.5% answered correctly)
- Wine coolers have less alcohol than beer (correct response is NO) (65.9% answered correctly)
- Is a stimulant (correct response is NO) (56.0% answered correctly)
- May cause cancer (correct response is YES) (53.7% answered correctly)
- Is fat soluble (correct response is NO) (48.0% answered correctly)

### 2.5.2 Marijuana Quiz Results

The following list ranks from highest to lowest how well participants answered the quiz for this drug category.

- May cause birth defects (correct response is YES) (86.7% answered correctly)
- May hurt immune system (correct response is YES) (79.8% answered correctly)
- Is less addictive than alcohol (correct response is NO) (74.3% answered correctly)
- Approved by FDA as a treatment for AIDS (correct response is NO) (66.5% answered correctly)
- May cause cancer (correct response is YES) (65.0% answered correctly)
- Is legal in some states (correct response is NO) (47.4% answered correctly)
- Is fat soluble (correct response is YES) (28.8% answered correctly)

### 2.5.3 Tobacco Quiz Results

The following list ranks from highest to lowest how well participants answered the quiz for this drug category.

- Causes cancer (correct response is YES) (94.2% answered correctly)
- Causes low birth weight (correct response is YES) (91.8% answered correctly)
- Is less addictive than alcohol (correct response is NO) (86.3% answered correctly)
- Causes early skin damage (correct response is YES) (80.8% answered correctly)
- Most users are addicted by age 14 (correct response is YES) (67.7% answered correctly)
- Will decrease reaction time (correct response is NO) (60.5% answered correctly)
- Use by teens increasing (correct response is NO) (22.8% answered correctly)

## 2.6 Training Needs

Faculty and staff reported training needs in the following areas:

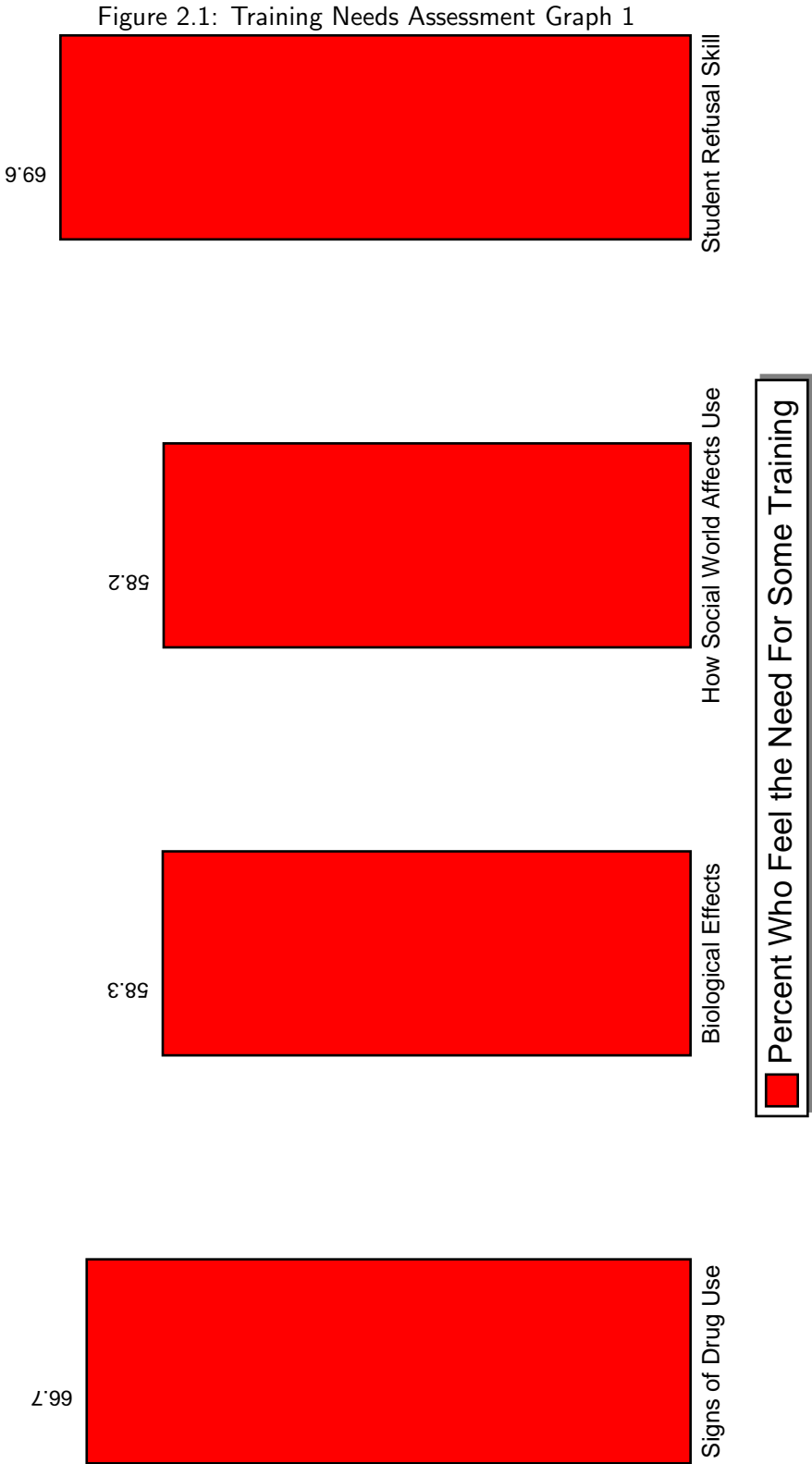
- Personal liabilities and responsibilities (75.9% said *I need training*)

- Locating and using community resources (69.8% said *I need training*)
- Student refusal skills (69.6% said *I need training*)
- Recognizing signs and symptoms of alcohol and drug use (66.7% said *I need training*)
- Alcohol and other drug curricula (63.0% said *I need training*)
- Biological effects of alcohol and drugs (58.3% said *I need training*)
- How the child's social world may affect alcohol and drug use (58.2% said *I need training*)

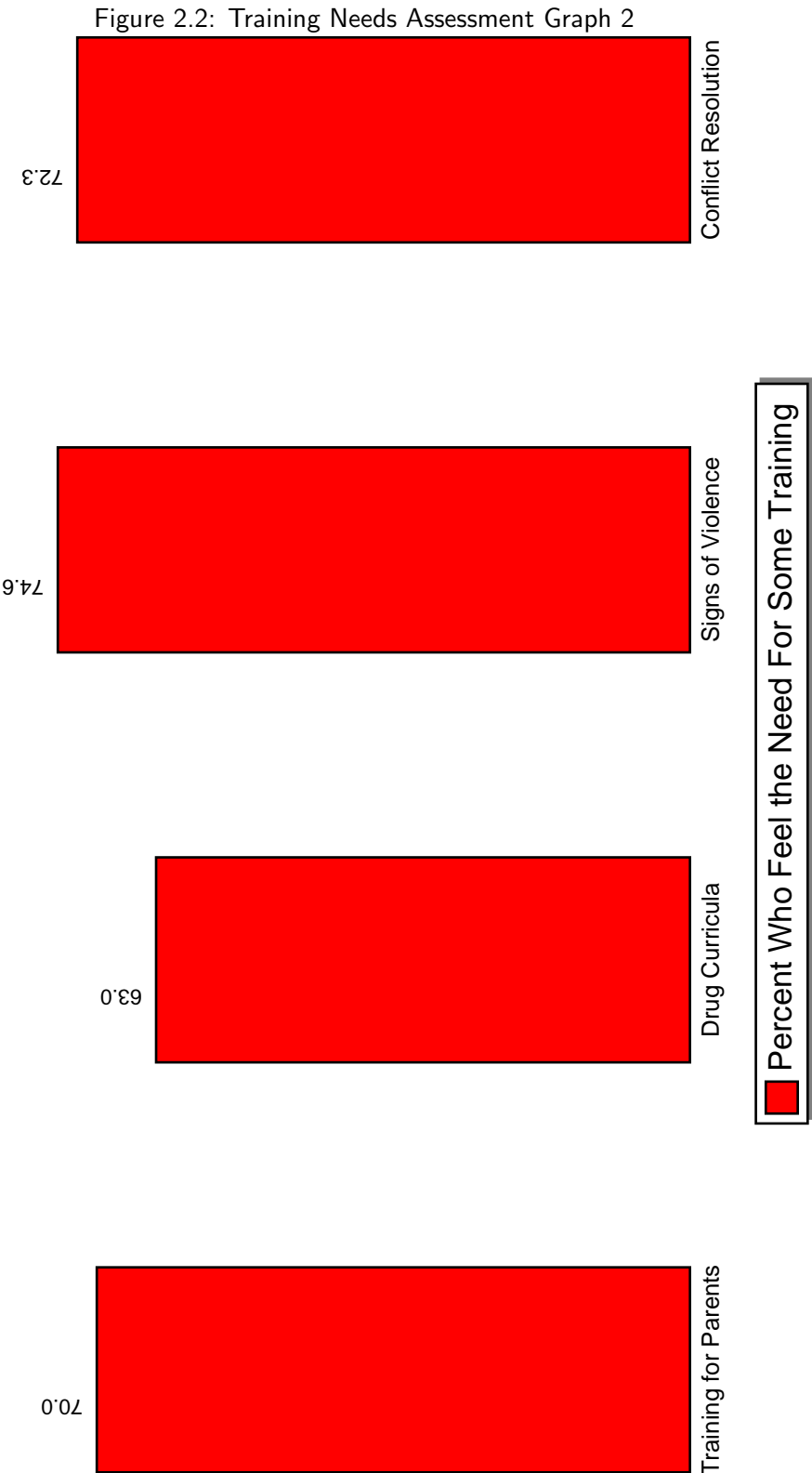

Training Needs Assessment Graph 1

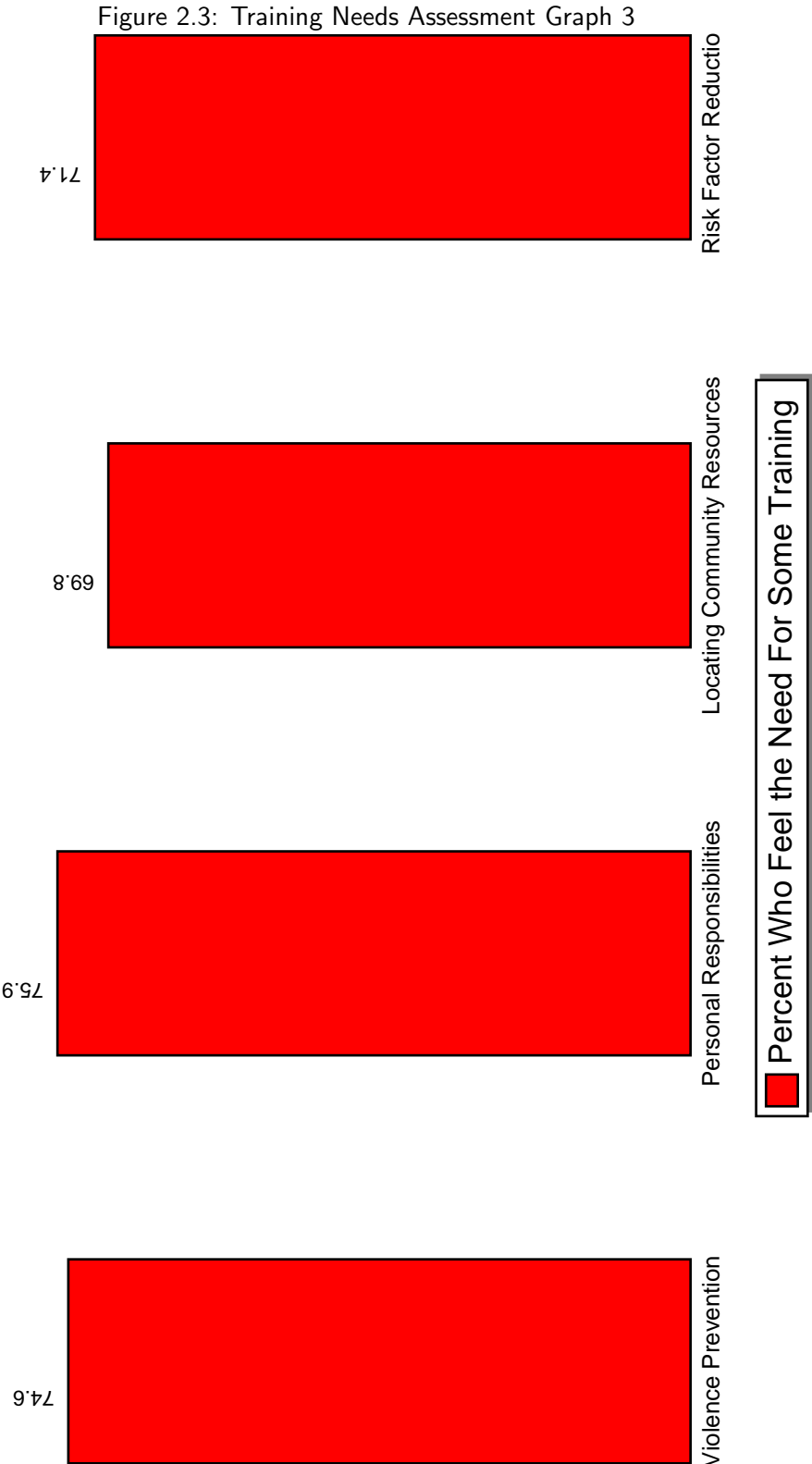

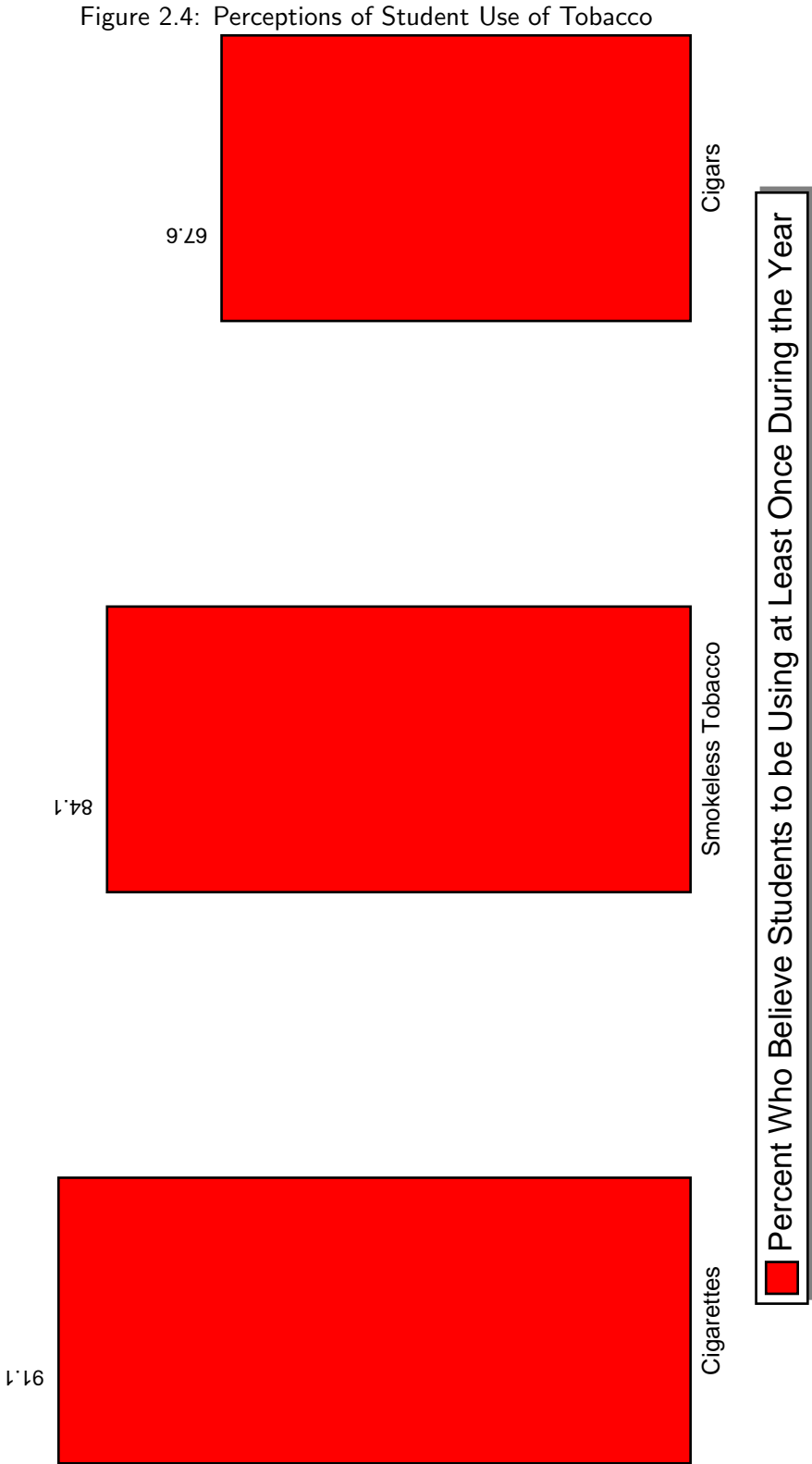

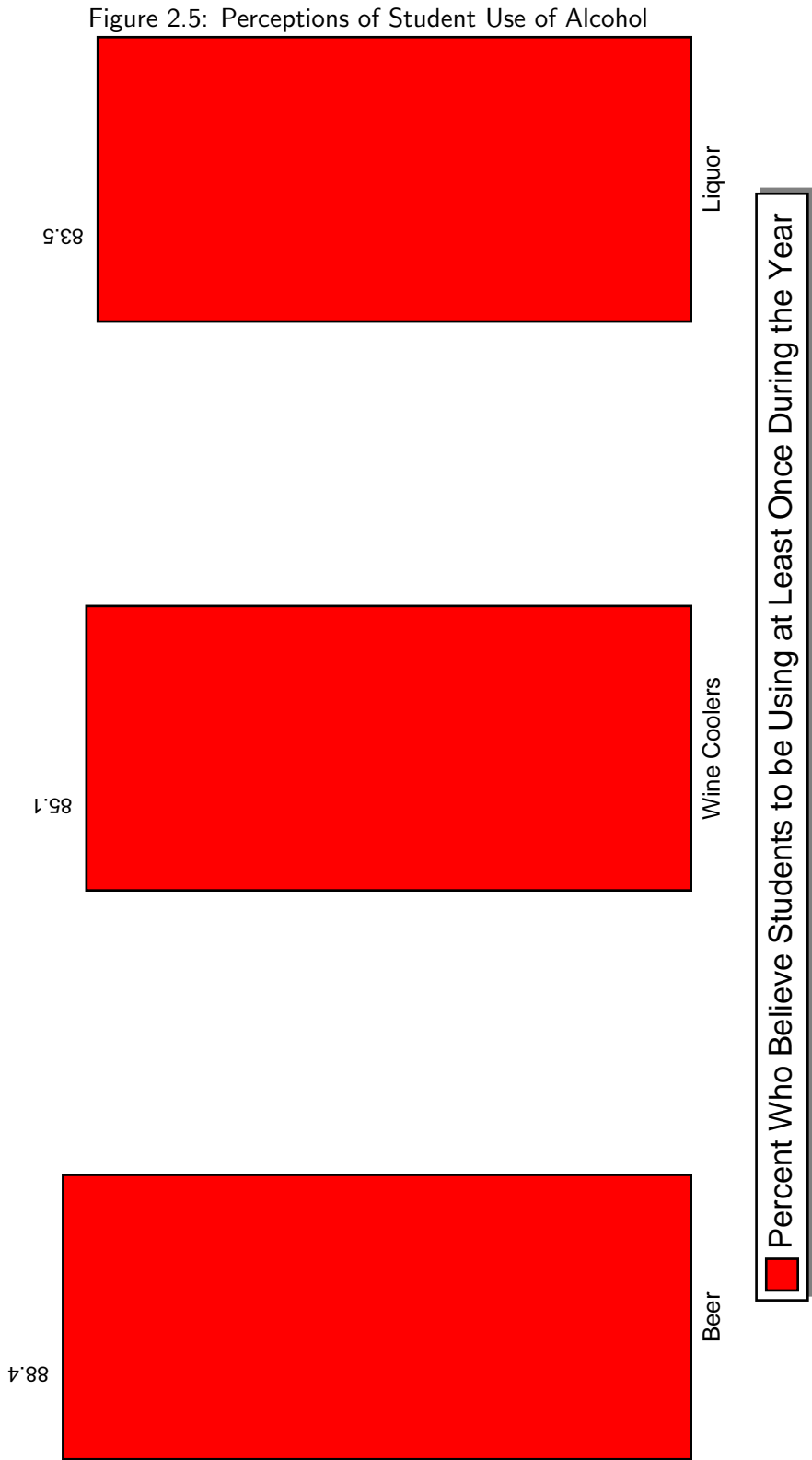

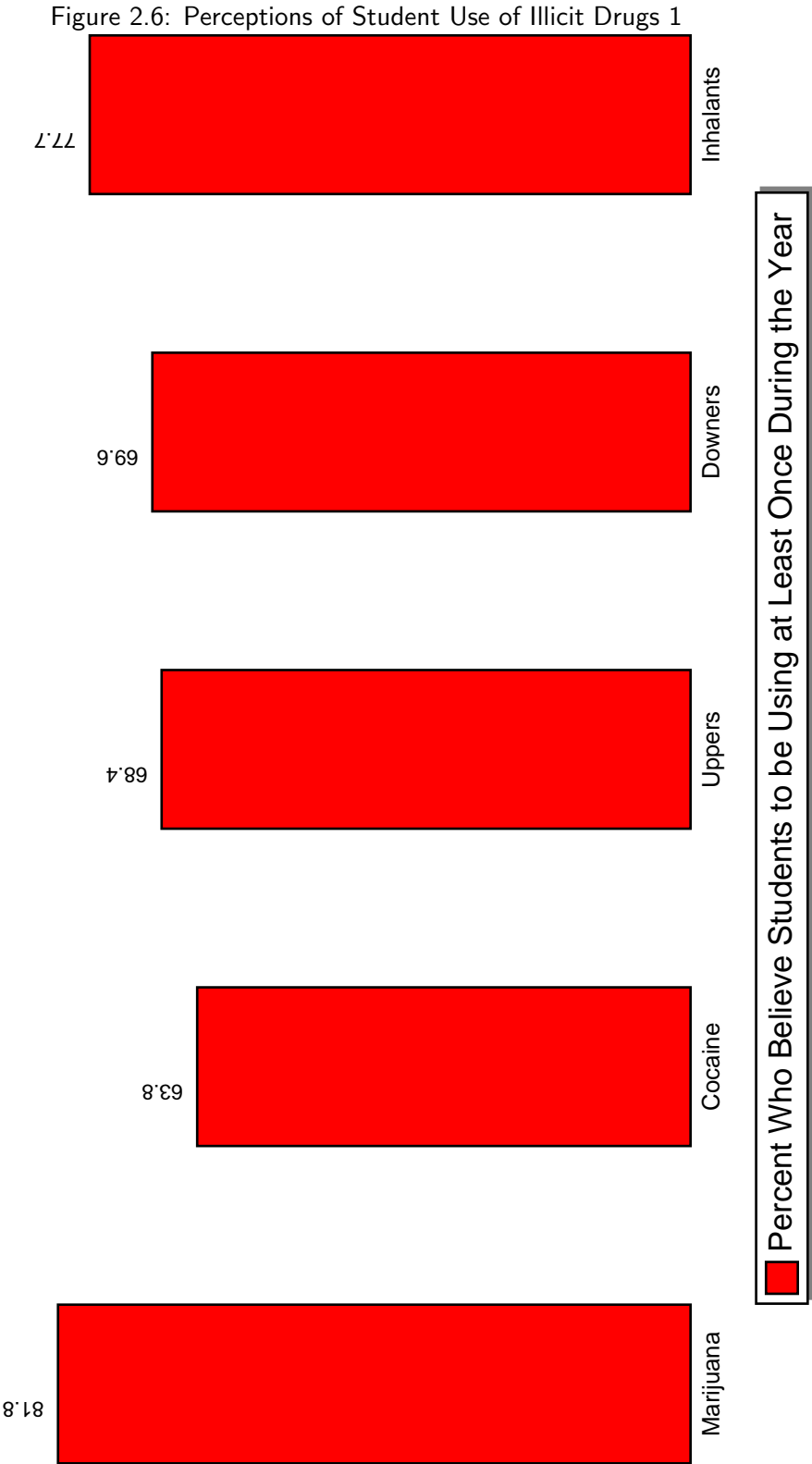
# Perceptions of Student Use of Tobacco



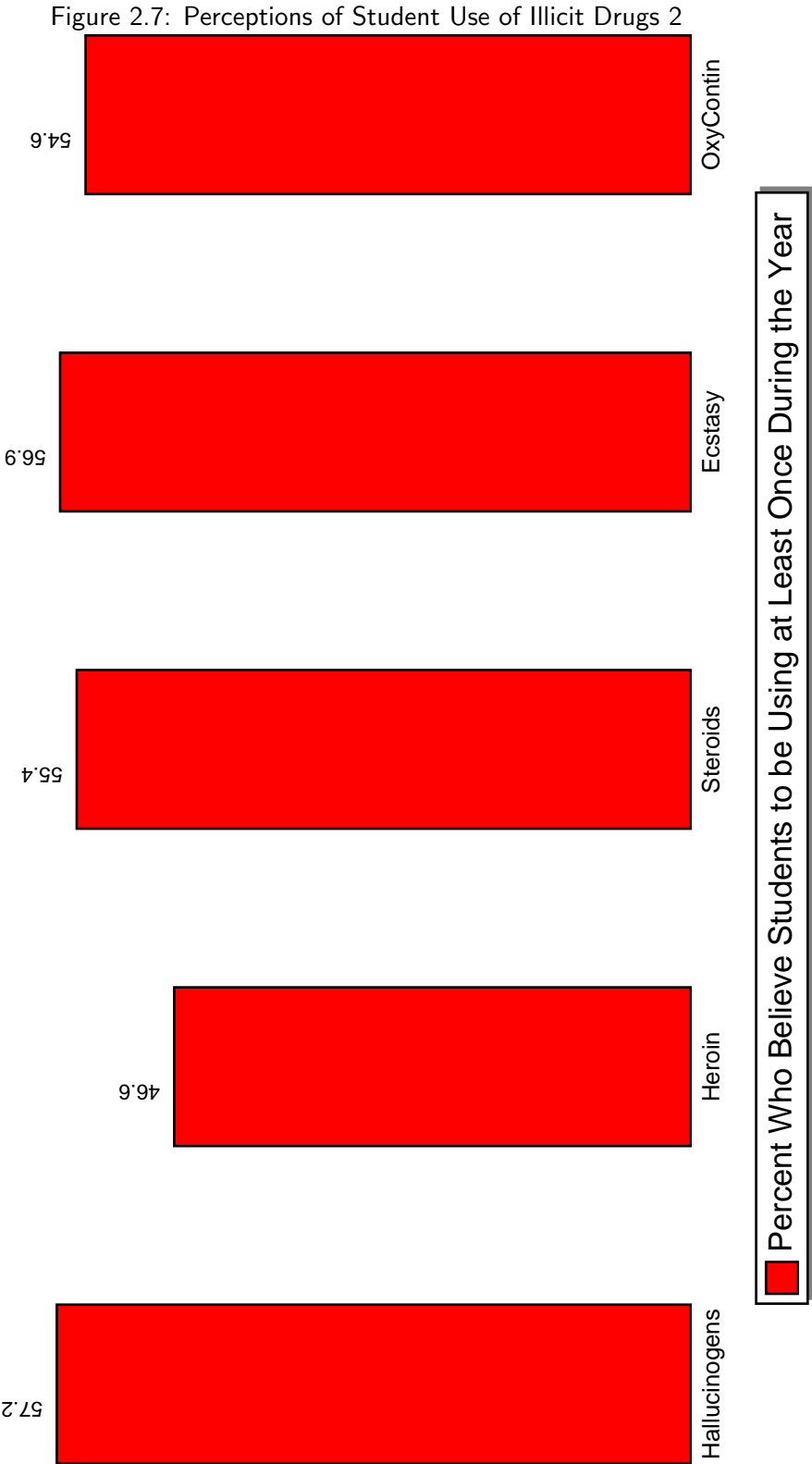
Perceptions of Student Use of Alcohol



# Perceptions of Student Use of Illicit Drugs 1



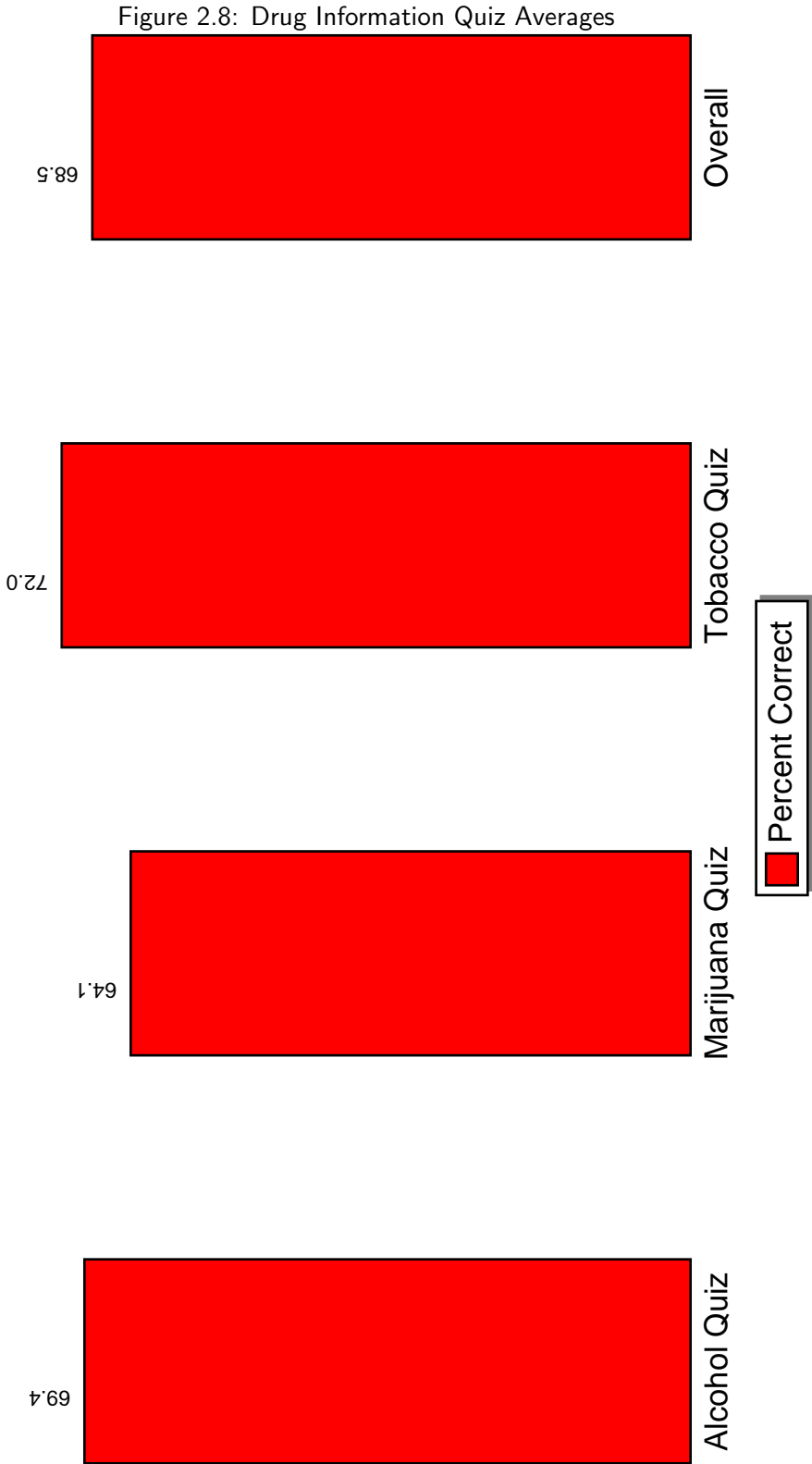
# Perceptions of Student Use of Illicit Drugs 2
